INVESTING IN INFRASTRUCTURE:

Ensuring Reliable Services for the Future

Critical water, sanitary sewer and stormwater system improvements will be funded through loans, fund balance transfers and user rate increases.

The Village of Hoffman Estates is committed to maintaining and improving its critical infrastructure, ensuring that residents continue to have reliable and efficient water, sanitary sewer and stormwater management services. With over \$55 million in improvements identified for these systems in the Village's five-year Capital Improvement Plan, a study was commissioned by the Village to evaluate user rates and provide guidance on how to fund these important infrastructure investments.

Water system investments will benefit the Village by ensuring the water distribution system continues to provide safe, reliable water to all Village businesses and residences. The five-year water system investments include:

- Water Main Replacements \$13.5 million
- Replacement/Rehabilitation of Water Towers and Pumping Stations \$9.5 million
- Backup Water Supplies \$6.3 million

Sanitary sewer investments focus on the proactive, cost-effective trenchless rehabilitation of pipe and rehabilitation of multiple lift stations.

Historian's notebook

oon we'll be into the month of June and sliding down the second half of the year 2025. It's amazing how quickly the time goes by. I think it's time for a listing of important dates that will be somewhat like a timeline but with little bits of info tossed in.

- The Hoffman Estates water tower at Golf and Roselle Roads was built in 1955.
- Residents living in Hoffman Estates in 1956 prior to incorporation had to share a 16-party phone line.
- The Hoffman Estates Fire Protection District was established in April 1958 in one of the small barns on the Hammerstein Farm located west of Roselle Road on Illinois Blvd.
- The residents of Hoffman Estates originally requested to be annexed to Schaumburg.
 Schaumburg rejected their request in January 1959.

- The summer of 1959 saw the opening of Hoffman Plaza, located on the east side of Roselle Road between Higgins and Golf Roads.
- Our history as an incorporated village began on September 23, 1959. The vote was 759 for and 569 against incorporation.
- The Hoffman Estates Police Department was founded in 1959 with offices located in our first Village Hall in the Hammerstein Farm House on Illinois Blvd.
- The Tropicana Swim Club was chartered on November 1, 1959, establishing the first privately owned swimming pool, located at 680 Audubon. F & S Construction donated the lot to the swim club, which opened in the summer of 1960 with 84 member families
- On January 22, 1964, the Illinois Supreme Court approved annexations for Hoffman

- Estates north of the Northwest Tollway, now the Jane Addams Tollway (I-90), making way for new development. This area is still referred to as North Hoffman even though it is part of incorporated Hoffman Estates.
- It was a cold winter day on February 4, 1966, when our first Post Office a branch of the Roselle Post Office opened in Hoffman Plaza. It wasn't until the fall of 1988 that the Hoffman Estates Post office on Gannon Drive opened.
- The Valli Produce grocery store located at Roselle and Bode Roads once housed Fireside Roller Rink which at one point was in the Guinness Book of World Records as world's largest indoor roller rink. I skated there many times and can still picture it when I'm there shopping.

The five-year sanitary sewer system investments include:

- Lift Station Replacement/Rehabilitation \$9.6 million
- Sanitary Sewer Pipe/Manhole Rehabilitation \$9.6 million

Stormwater investments focus on cost-effective trenchless rehabilitation of aging storm sewer pipes that serve large areas of the community. While nearly 10,000 feet of pipe has been rehabilitated or replaced already, the investment over the next five years includes an additional \$6 million in rehabilitation or replacement.

The Village plans to leverage multiple funding sources to finance these projects, including low-interest IEPA loans, General Fund reserve transfers, and gradual user rate increases. Starting May 1, combined water and sewer rates in Hoffman Estates will increase by six percent, from \$14.47/1,000 gallons to \$15.44/1,000 gallons. In alignment with the study, additional incremental increases to the water and sewer rates are also expected annually over the next four years, with six percent increases each in 2026 and 2027 and four percent increases each in 2028 and 2029.

Stormwater rates will see a one-time increase this year. Residential rates will increase between \$2 and \$6 per month, depending on lot size.

Along with the planned improvements to the water and sewer systems, increases to the water rates reflect the assumption that the City of Chicago will annually increase what it charges for the purchase of Lake Michigan water. Those increases are forecasted to be three percent each year.

Because infrastructure needs evolve and financial assumptions can shift, the Village Board will reassess the future rate increases annually to ensure that any future adjustments align with actual project costs and community needs. The Water, Sewer, and Stormwater Rate study that was conducted is available for review on the Village's website at hoffmanestates.org/water-sewer.






Smoke detector requirements for your home

Proper smoke alarm placement is crucial for safety. Here is where they must be installed:

- Bedrooms & Sleeping Areas: One inside each bedroom and one outside each bedroom in the immediate vicinity (within 15 feet).
- Multiple Stories: At least one on every level, including basements and habitable attics.
- Split-Level Homes: A single alarm on the upper level may suffice if the lower level is less than one full story below.
- Bathroom Proximity: At least 3 feet away from bathroom doors to prevent false alarms.

Interconnection Requirements

When one alarm sounds, they all should. For new construction, alarms must be hardwired and interconnected. In homes undergoing alterations, wireless interconnected alarms (with a 10-year sealed battery) may be used instead of hardwired alarms. In rentals, hardwired alarms must be 10-year sealed battery and remain hardwired.

Following these requirements ensures your home is up to code and your family stays safe.

New this year, Groot is offering residents seasonal composting as part of the yard waste collection program. Residents using a Groot yard waste cart or their own rigid plastic container (no more than 50 lbs. or 32 gallons) may include organic food scraps along with yard waste for composting. Organic compost waste is not accepted in paper landscape bags.

Accepted:

- Fruits & Vegetables
- Bread, Grains
- Pasta, Cereal
- Dairy (no liquids)
- Coffee Grounds & Tea Leaves

Not accepted:

- Paper Products (paper towels, plates, napkins, egg cartons, pizza boxes)
- · Glass, Plastics & Styrofoam
- Diapers, Pet Litter & Waste
- Teabags & Coffee Filters
- · Liquids, Grease & Oil
- · Meat, Poultry or Seafood (no shells or bones)

May is Stroke Awareness Month

Remember, it is crucial to act fast if you suspect someone is having a stroke. Early intervention can improve the chances of a positive outcome.

Learn the **FAST** acronym used for Face, Arms, Speech, and Time, to help identify the signs of a stroke.

- **FACE:** Ask the person to smile. Does one side of their face droop?
- **ARMS:** Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drop or feel weak?
- SPEECH: Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Does their speech slur or sound unclear?
- **TIME:** If you notice any of these signs, call 911 immediately. Time is critical in treating a stroke.

Other Stroke Symptoms Watch for Sudden:

- NUMBNESS or weakness of face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- CONFUSION, trouble speaking or understanding speech
- TROUBLE SEEING in one or both eyes
- TROUBLE WALKING, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- SEVERE HEADACHE with no known cause

It's important to call 911 as soon as possible when experiencing any of these symptoms.



Osteoporosis is a progressive disease that weakens bones, making them fragile and more likely to fracture. In fact, approximately 54 million Americans have osteoporosis.

Permit applications for these projects are processed online through the Village's eTRAKiT permit portal. Online permit submittals ensure a faster and more streamlined process that makes it easier to obtain permits and correspond digitally with multiple reviewers.
