POLICE DEPARTMENT RECOGNIZED AS BEST IN STATE

The Hoffman Estates Police Department has been awarded First Place in the Illinois Traffic Safety Challenge for departments with 51-100 sworn police officers. Additionally, the Department was recognized by the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) in a special category for best Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Program. Both honors were awarded at a State Conference in Rosemont, IL on August 3, 2006.

The Traffic Safety Challenge is a program that recognizes law enforcement in the state for their actions in promoting highway safety in their community. The awards are based on policy and procedures, public education, enforcement, officer training, and the effectiveness of the combined efforts. Additionally, the Hoffman Estates Police Department won a \$7,000 speed trailer from Decatur Electronics, Decatur, IL.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Recreational Equipment Storage

Residents are reminded that mobile homes, boats, trailers, jet skis, snowmobiles and similar recreational vehicles may be stored on your property, provided you comply with the following Village regulations: Recreational equipment stored in a front or side yard adjacent to a street must be parked on a permitted driveway surface (concrete or asphalt).

Recreational equipment stored in a side yard or backyard must be parked on crushed stone, gravel, brick pavers or on a permitted driveway surface (concrete or asphalt)

Recreational equipment stored in a side yard must be parked behind the principle front building line of the adjacent property.

At no time can any recreational equipment be stored on the grass and the public right of way must never be blocked or be obstructed by any part of the recreational vehicle.

West Nile Virus Surveillance Program

The Illinois Department of Public Health will be testing a wider range of birds this year for the West Nile Virus. For 2006, all perching birds, which includes: crows, blue jays, grackles, starlings, sparrows, finches, robins, cardinals, flycatchers, swallows, catbirds, mockingbirds, warblers and wrens, will be accepted and tested. Residents calling to report a dead bird are instructed to call the Cook County Health Department, West Nile Virus Hotline at 708-492-2650. Birds will only be collected if they have been dead less than 24 hours and are in good condition, showing no evidence of decay, attack or road kill.

The Cook County Health Department will continue to track the distribution of West Nile Virus for control efforts. Residents are encouraged to report a dead bird via the website, at www.cookcountypublichealth.org. Go to Programs and Services and click on Environmental Health-West Nile Virus. Those with out internet access can make a report by calling 708-492-2650.

School Phobia

As the new school year approaches, it is important to keep a few things in mind in order to help children have a successful year. **Did you know about 2% of school children develop a school phobia?** The phobia can be a result of a variety of things including starting in a new school, if child has been victim of a bully, illness, performance anxiety.

Parents, teachers, and counselors should work together to identify the source of the phobia and work to help the child feel more secure. All involved need to remind the child that staying home is not an option.

Also, keep in mind that each school year has different challenges and that children may need additional or different types of support. As children grow and develop, new challenges exist.

Helping your Children by providing structure:

Children succeed when they know what is expected and are provided structure. Here are a few tips for parents on how to provide positive structure for their child:

- Together with your child decide when home work will be done
- Provide a study area
- Establish homework standards
- Set rules for TV viewing
- Establish daily reading time
- Establish a bedtime (rest is essential for memory and concentration)
- Insist on a well balanced breakfast (children need plenty of fuel)

Most importantly, children need parental support and understanding.

The Village has tentatively scheduled its Flu Vaccine Clinics for November 2006. The clinic dates will be based on when the Department of Health and Human Services receives the vaccine shipment. Happy Birthday to the Village of Hoffman Estates! We are 47 years old and fast approaching our 50th anniversary. On September 19, 1959 the residents of Hoffman Estates voted for incorporation after two other unsuccessful attempts.

Those early years always bring back memories of the propane tanks in the back yards before the natural gas lines came into town, the muddy streets that caused headaches for those who were moving in on a rainy day and the trips to Roselle for groceries at Gorski's. You always had to get to the store before 6 p.m. to buy your meat. Back then the butchers couldn't sell meat after 6. Everyone was happy when Jewel opened in Hoffman Plaza in 1959. Everyone's phone was on a party line. Up to 6 people could share the same line. You never knew who might be using the phone when you needed to make a call.

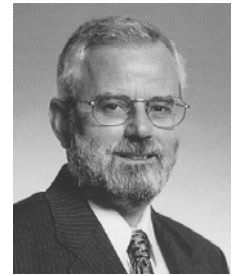

MAYOR MCLEOD**

This September, the Village Board will be considering a comprehensive Smoking Ban within the Village of Hoffman Estates.

The Mayors of Hoffman Estates, Arlington Heights, Palatine, Rolling Meadows and Schaumburg have taken the proactive approach to pledge to each other not to pass a Smoking Ban unless all five communities are able to pass similar bans. In past discussions surrounding Smoking Bans, concerns for the business community have been raised because many feel that a community-specific ban would put some businesses at a disadvantage when their competitors in the next town over are not held to the same standards. This proactive approach is meant to create a level playing field. Rather than wait for the State legislature to act on the matter, our communities have decided to work together to protect the interests of businesses and the health of non-smokers who are exposed to second-hand smoke in restaurants, places of employment and public spaces.

There may never be a perfect solution to the problem of second-hand and environmental smoke exposure. Some feel that it is not the place of government to interfere at this level. However, these are the issues of great public debate and I am extremely encouraged by the efforts of these five municipalities in the Northwest Suburbs as they take a proactive approach to addressing the situation in a responsible manner.

The members of the Village Board and I welcome your comments on this and any other matter. The proposed ordinance will be discussed at first reading on September 5, at 8:00 pm and at second reading on September 25, at 7:00 pm in the Village Hall Council Chambers located at 1900 Hassell Road. All are welcome and encouraged to attend these and any other Village Board meeting. BRANCH PICK-UP RESUMES SEPTEMBER 25

The curbside tree branch pick-up program, which offers free pick-up, will begin Monday, September 25. The pick-up schedule for your area can be found below.

This free program is for residents covered by the Village refuse collection contract. Routes and dates have been established for various sections of the community.

Branches must be set out for pick-up by 7:00 am by the first date listed for a particular area. **Only one collection pass will be made for each street. Please do not ask for exceptions.**

If branches are too large, are mixed with unacceptable materials, or have not been prepared properly, they will **not** be picked up.

Public Works crews will **NOT** accept:

- Tree trunks, stumps or root balls
- Firewood
- Railroad ties or landscape timbers
- Lumber, fencepost or other wood objects
- Grass clippings, leaves, sod, plants or yard waste

Public Works crews **WILL** accept:

- Tree branches no larger than 8 inches in diameter or 10 feet in length.
- Shrub trimmings and similar brush
- Branches from willow trees if separated from other materials

On the first date of pick-up listed for your area, neatly stack branches at curbside by 7:00 am. Face cut ends toward the street. Please do not tie branches in bundles or place in any container. Do not allow branches to protrude into the street or block sidewalks.

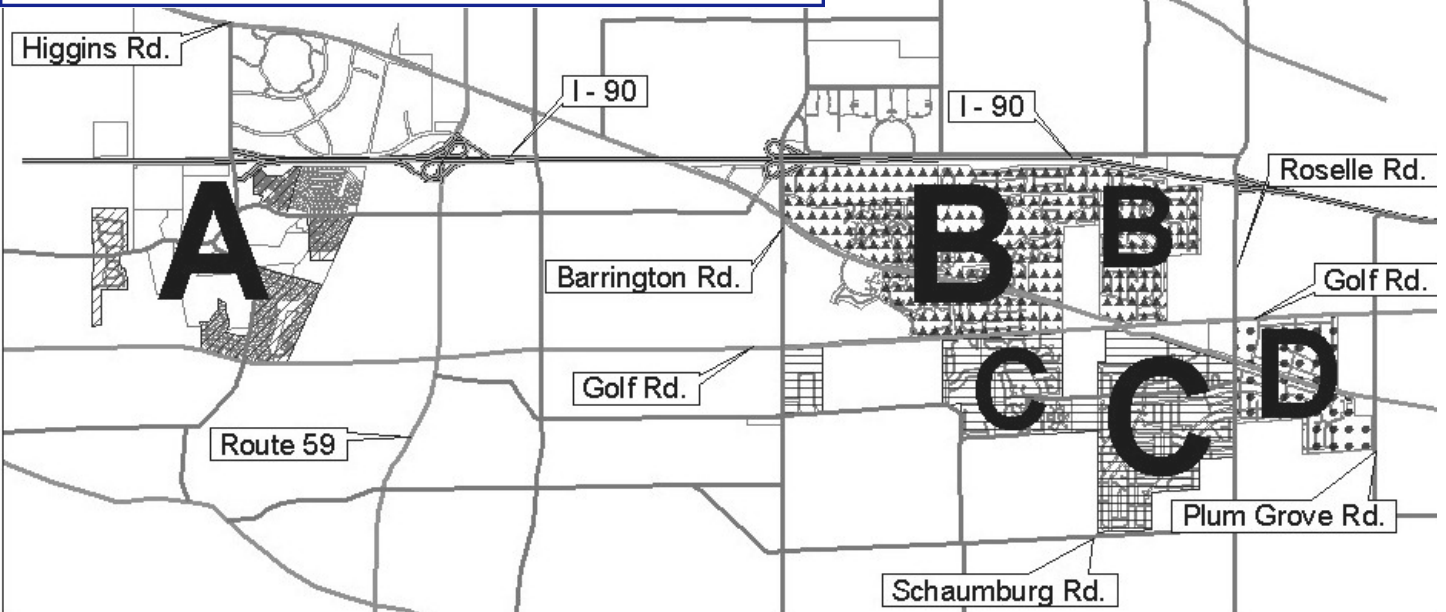
While supplies last, free woodchips will be available to residents at the Village's Vehicle Maintenance Facility, 2405 Pembroke Ave, during daylight hours **after 3:00 pm** Monday through Friday and during daylight hours on weekends. Please bring your own containers.

- A. Beginning September 25: All streets north of the Tollway (I-90). All streets west of Rte. 59.
- B. Beginning October 2: All streets within the boundaries north of Golf Road, south of the Tollway, east of Barrington Road and west of Roselle Road.
- C. Beginning October 9: All streets within the boundaries north of Schaumburg Road, south of Golf Road, east of Barrington Road and west of Roselle Road.
- D. Beginning October 16: All streets within the boundaries north of Schaumburg Road, south of Golf Road, east of Roselle Road and west of Plum Grove Road.
